NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1. NATURE OF ACTIVITIES

Project Exploration (PE) is a nonprofit science education organization whose mission is to create transformative learning opportunities for youth underrepresented in the sciences - particularly students of color and girls - by equipping them with the skills, practices, and mindset needed for a lifelong pursuit of learning.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Adoption of Accounting Pronouncement

Effective September 1, 2018, the Organization adopted Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2016-14, Presentation of Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Entities. The ASU amends the current reporting model for nonprofit organizations and enhances their required disclosures. The major changes include: (a) requiring the presentation of only two classes of net assets now entitled "net assets without donor restrictions" and "net assets with donor restrictions", (b) modifying the presentation of underwater endowment funds and related disclosures, (c) requiring the use of the placed in service approach to recognize the expirations of restrictions on gifts used to acquire or construct long-lived assets absent explicit donor stipulations otherwise, (d) requiring that all nonprofits present an analysis of expenses by function and nature in either the statement of activities, a separate statement, or in the notes and disclose a summary of the allocation methods used to allocate costs, (e) requiring the disclosure of quantitative and qualitative information regarding liquidity and availability of resources, (f) presenting investment return net of external and direct expenses, and (g) modifying other financial statement reporting requirements and disclosures intended to increase the usefulness of nonprofit financial statements.

Contributions

Contributions received are recorded as support without donor restrictions or support with donor restrictions support depending on the existence of any donor restrictions. When a donor restriction expires, net assets with donor restrictions are reclassified to net assets without donor restrictions and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. Donor restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same accounting period as that in which they are received are reported as support without donor restrictions.

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for not-for-profit organizations.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Functional Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

Subsequent Events

The financial statements were available to be issued on July 14, 2021, with subsequent events being evaluated through this date.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash Equivalents

Cash equivalents consist of short-term, highly liquid investments which are readily available for current use. Bank accounts are insured by the FDIC up to \$250,000. At August 31, 2020, the Organization did not have bank accounts whose cash balances exceeded the FDIC insured limit.

Liquidity

The Organization has \$ 267,209 of financial assets available within one year of the balance sheet date to meet cash needs for general expenditures consisting of cash of \$77,085, Grants Receivable of \$190,124. None of the financial assets are subject to donor or other contractual restrictions that make them unavailable for general expenditure within one year of the balance sheet date.

Fixed Assets

Project Exploration follows the practice of capitalizing, at cost, all expenditures for fixed assets over \$1,000. Depreciation is computed on a straight-line basis over the useful lives of the assets generally as follows:

NOTE 4. DONATED SERVICES AND FACILITIES

The Organization receives donated services from a variety of unpaid volunteers assisting the Organization in its programs. However, these donated services are not reflected in the financial statements because they do not meet the criteria for recognition of such volunteer effort. Donated services, which include legal services, are reflected in the statement of activities at their fair value where they do meet the criteria for recognition. For the year ended August 31, 2020, the value of donated legal services amounted to \$89,788.

Effective September 1, 2013, the Organization entered into a formal lease agreement with the Board of Education of the City of Chicago that expired June 30, 2014. No new agreement has been signed as of August 31, 2020. The Organization has estimated that the fair market value of donated rent is \$10,000 per year.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 5. NOTE PAYABLE / RELATED PARTIES

The Organization signed a note dated September 18, 2013, due to Gerald A. Kolschowsky and Karen A. Kolschowsky, with a principal sum of \$75,000 and no interest. As of March 01,2020, the loan was canceled, as charitable contribution and gift to Project Exploration.

One of the Board members is related to Gerald A. Kolschowsky and Karen A. Kolschowsky.

NOTE 6. PAYROLL PROTECTION PROGRAM REFUNDABLE ADVANCE

On April 30, 2020, the Organization received the 1st round of the Paycheck Protection Program ("PPP") established by the US Government Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. The PPP provides for assistance for qualifying entities to support personnel costs and other immediate needs. Project Exploration received \$110,022 in the form of a loan, administered by the SBA (Small Business Administration). This loan and accrued interest are forgivable provided certain guidelines are met. The Organization had not applied for loan forgiveness as of August 31, 2020, and so the amount of the loan remains an outstanding liability on its Statement of Financial Position.

NOTE 7: SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The COVID-19 outbreak has caused business disruption and cancellation of events and projects in 2020. While the disruption is currently expected to be temporary, there is considerable uncertainty around the duration of the disruptions and the impact on the Organization's employees and other stakeholders. The extent to which COVID -19 may impact the Organization's financial condition or results cannot be reasonably estimated at this time.
